HOW CAN YOU PLAY A PART?

Look out for anything that is **A**bnormal, **I**rregular, **S**trange or **U**nusual (**A.I.S.U**)

- 1** Persons who
 - ✓ Look nervous
 - ✓ Wear overly bulky attire
 - ✓ Take notes or photos/videos of security features (CCTV cameras etc.)
 - ✓ Ask strange questions (schedule of security officers etc.)
- 2** Suspicious Items
 - ✓ Unattended
 - ✓ Give off unusual smell
 - ✓ Wires sticking out



3 What should you do?

 Report to our staff or call **999 IMMEDIATELY!**

If it is unsafe to do so, report via SGSecure App or SMS to 71999

How should you report?

Use **T.E.L.L.**

- **T**otal number of persons involved
- **E**quipment/weapons being carried or description of items
- **L**ook of the persons and their activity
- **L**ocation and time of activity



In the event of a terrorist attack.

RUN

away from danger

- ✓ Consider the safest route
- ✓ Insist others leave with you
- ✓ Leave your belongings behind



HIDE

if you can't escape

- ✓ Hide and stay out of sight. Place heavy objects such as tables behind doors to prevent access by attackers
- ✓ Be very quiet and switch your phone to silent mode



TELL

when it is safe

- ✓ Call the Police at 999 or SMS 71999 if you can't talk
- ✓ Provide details on your location and the attackers
- ✓ Use the SGSecure app to share more information such as photos and videos



Improved First Aid Skills (IFAS): **PRESS, TIE, TELL**



PRESS directly on the wound to stop the bleeding using items such as cloth. If bleeding does not stop, proceed to TIE.



TIE at least 5 cm above the wound using items such as neck tie, belt, handkerchief or lanyard



TELL SCDF about the injury and time the wound was tied.
